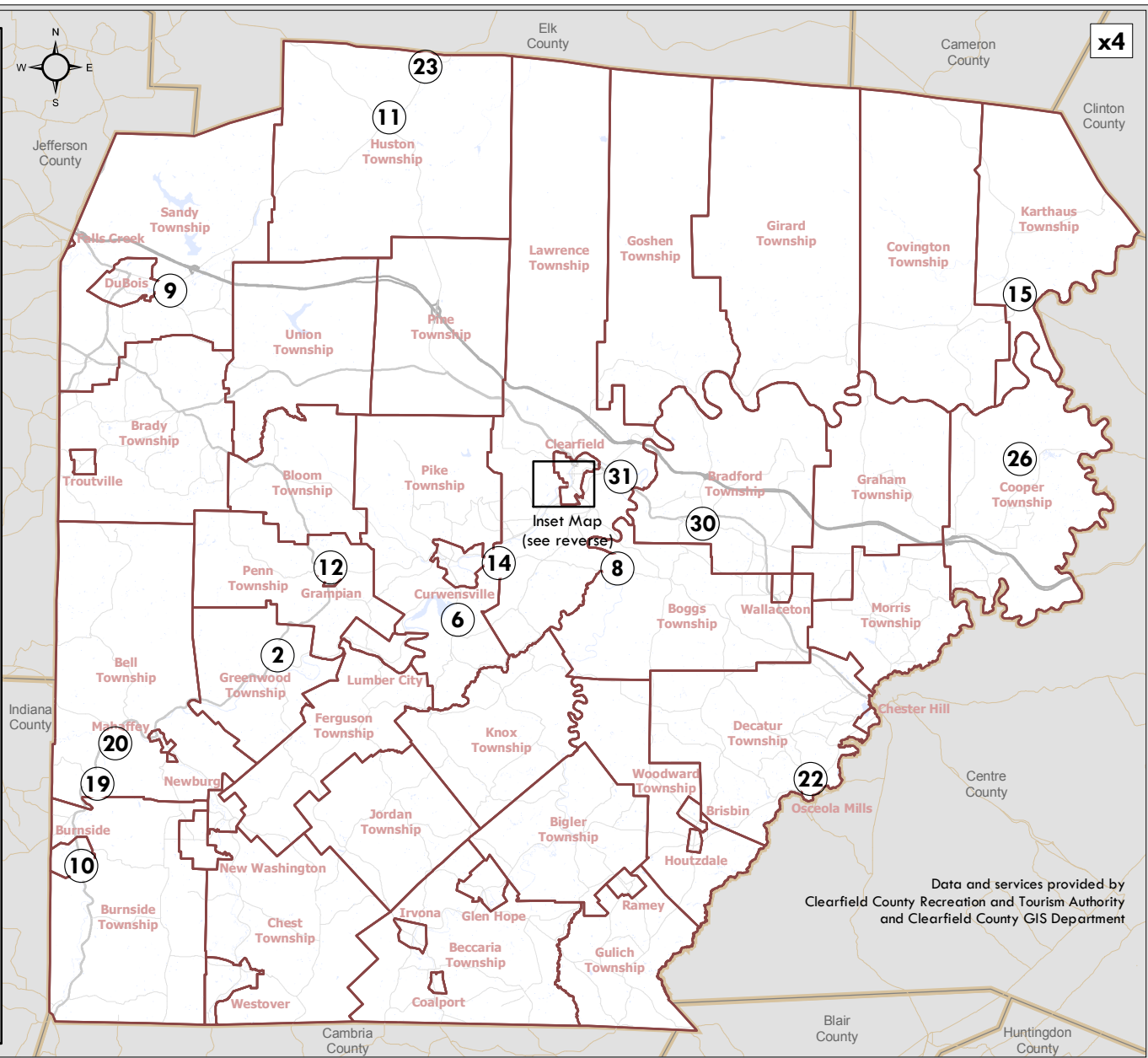

**1. Bigler House**

Marker erected by Johnston, Nelson & Shimmel, LLP.  
Located in front of 106 East Pine Street

**2. Bridge in Greenwood Twp.**

Bridge is listed on National Register of Historic Places

**3. Chinklacamoose**

Near service station on Old Town Road (South 2nd Street) near intersection with SR 879 bypass in Lawrence Township

**4. Clearfield County**

Corner of Front Street and East Pine Street in Clearfield Borough

**5. County's First Jail**

Along west side of SR 153 in Clearfield Borough, just south of downtown

**6. Curwensville Dam**

Along SR 453 (not along the dam)

**7. Daniel Ogden**

Marker in front yard of building on corner of SR 879/153 and Ogden Avenue in Clearfield

**8. Dimeling Bridge**

Along SR 2024 (Old Erie Pike) over Clearfield Creek

**9. DuBois**

In front of Shaffer Road entrance to DuBois Mall (main entrance near mall sign)

**10. George Atcheson**

Near intersection of US 219 and First Avenue in Burnside

**11. George Rosenkrans**

In front of Penfield United Methodist Church on SR 255 Northeast of intersection with SR 153

**12. Grampian**

At intersection of US 219 and Penn Street (in front of Quaker Meeting House) in Grampian

**13. Hillcrest Cemetery**

On center "island" at main entrance to cemetery along Cemetery Road in Clearfield Borough

**14. Hogback Bridge**

Along Old Erie Pike (just off SR 879 Northeast of Curwensville)

**15. Karthaus Furnace**

In front of park fence along SR 879 in Karthaus

**16. Kurtz Brothers**

In front of Kurtz Brothers building along SR 322 in Clearfield Borough

**17. Kurtz Brothers Building**

Between East Market Street and East Locust Street on west side of SR 153 in Clearfield Borough

**18. Kurtz Field**

Corner of West 2nd Avenue and Patterson Street in Clearfield

**19. Last Raft**

In front of Purchase Line North Elementary School on US 219

**20. McGees Mills Covered Bridge**

Off US 219, Marker is on south side of bridge above entry

**21. Murray House**

In front of house along east side of SR 153 in Clearfield

**22. Osceola Mills**

At intersection of Curtin Street and Lingle Street (in the town square) in Osceola Mills

**23. Philip P. Bliss**

In front of industrial supply business NE of Penfield on SR 255

**24. Presbyterian Church**

Corner of North 2nd Street and East Pine Street in Clearfield

**25. Senator William W. Betts**

Located in downtown Clearfield near parking lot

**26. St. Severins Church**

Off SR 53 near Grassflat in Cooper Township

**27. Trout Stocking**

Near Fullerton Street Bridge in Lawrence Township

**28. William Bigler**

In front of CBT on east side of SR 153 in Clearfield Borough

**29. William I. Betts**

At edge of rear parking lot for St. Francis Church (along South Front Street) in Clearfield

**30. Woodland**

Near intersection of SR 2030 (Main Street) and SR 2049

**31. Zenas Leonard**

On SR 322 near intersection with Leonard Street
